Steve Young

He served 20 years in UK law enforcement investigating economic crime specialising in the pro-active investigation of Banking Fraud, Bribery & Corruption, Whistleblowing and Money Laundering. This was followed by 6 years at Citigroup Inc. as EMEA Regional Director of Investigations, and 8 years as Barclays Bank Plc, Global Head of Investigations for Investment Banking & Wealth Management. Currently Head of Fraud & Investigations in Group Compliance at Lombard Odier, based in Geneva. To date, 40 years of international economic crime experience in both a law enforcement and corporate environment.

Joanelle O'Cleirgh



Joanelle is a Partner at Arthur Cox LLP. She works for a broad range of clients, particularly those in the healthcare, life sciences and regulated sectors. The Hon. Justice Frank Clarke, former Chief Justice of Ieland



The Hon. Justice Frank Clarke served as Chief Justice of Ireland from July 2017 to October 2021. Born in Dublin in 1951, he earned a B.A. in Mathematics and Economics from University College Dublin before pursuing law at King's Inns. Clarke practiced primarily in commercial and public law, later becoming a judge of the High Court in 2004 and then a judge of the Supreme Court in 2012. He held various leadership roles in legal organizations and academia, including serving as Chair of the Bar Council and Council of King's Inns. Clarke has been involved in legal education as a professor and adjunct professor at several institutions. Notably, he chaired the Referendum Commission on the Lisbon Treaty II in 2009 and has been active in EU legal matters. Currently, he chairs the Civil Legal Aid Review Group and serves as President of the Law Reform Commission.



Paul Scallan



Paul Scallan is Chief Executive of the Private Security Authority. He worked in the PSA for 8 years before becoming Chief Executive in 2015 and was responsible for the introduction of individual licensing in 2007 and has overseen the extension of contractor licensing across many sectors. In addition, he has developed standards in a number of areas and was the PSA's Chief Inspector for a short period before his appointment to Chief Executive. He has over 30 years' experience in the Civil Service and has worked across a number of Departments including the Department of Social Protection and Revenue Commissioners.

Ian Drennan



lan Drennan is Chief Executive Officer and the sole appointed member of the Corporate Enforcement Authority. He has extensive experience in the areas of investigation, regulation and civil and criminal enforcement and of leading entities having a public interest mandate, having previously held the positions of Director of Corporate Enforcement and Chief Executive Officer of the Irish Auditing & Accounting Supervisory Authority. He is a member of the Advisory Council on Economic Crime & Corruption, the Anti-money Laundering Steering Committee and the Company Law Review Group. He is also a member of the Medical Council, the statutory regulator of medical doctors in Ireland, where he is Chairman of the Audit Committee and a member of the Fitness to Practice Committee.

Orla Shevlin is a Deputy Director in the Cartels Division of the Competition and Consumer Protection Commission (CCPC) having joined the CCPC in 2022. Seána Cunningham



Seána Cunningham is the Director of the Enforcement and Anti-Money Laundering Directorate in Central Bank of Ireland.
